At that meeting, a very hot issue surrounding Milfoil weeds. For the new residents on the lake, Milfoil weeds can spread rapidly forming mats of vegetation on the lake. It can interfere with recreational activities such as swimming, boating, and fishing as well. Our board member Mark is actively seeking help from UNH student volunteers to map our Milfoil infestation.

Resignation of the President of Silver Lake Association, Terry Threlfall

We were notified on August 13th that Terry would be resigning as president, effective immediately. He has a very demanding workload with more to come and with the best interest of the Association he felt he needed to step down. The Association has taken on multiple activities this year to help permanently resolve the


We are sorry to see Terry step down as President but truly understand that his commitment must be to his family and work first.


Milfoil Mitigation 2021/2022


The Silver Lake Association will be applying for State Funding in which these funds if granted can help mitigate the Milfoil weeds. The application process provides the state to conduct mapping of the lake. The mapping of the lake was completed on August 10th. It is good to also hear that Winnisquam is having great efforts in leading the effort on Milfoil removal which indicates that our lake should be in good shape. Aqualogic will be on the lake to pick milfoil and curly leaf pondweed the end of August.

There has been a concerted effort from our board member Dawn Marie to fight the Milfoil problem. She has worked with the University of New Hampshire and 2021 AmeriCorps Participants to use Silver Lake as their training site to become "Weed Control Diver" certified. The 12 AmeriCorps students harvested a total of 32 gallons in June of 2021. In July students (5 participants from 3 different lakes) took 12.5 gallons of milfoil from our lake on a VERY rainy Sunday. There are currently two more groups scheduled in August. Both their productivity and any additional harvesting will be reported to the board.
